



Design your digital file in Phonoshop or Corel or similar program. Print 8" x 10" image nero archival paper (can be purchased at a professional photography store), and assemble your elements together in one place: sequins, iliver mads, glitter, glue, bocking paper, orc. Glue the archival print onto the backing paper by putting the glue on the back of the print first, keeping away from the edges. Press the paper down imp place, then proceed to glue on the 5-D elements. Allow to dry overnight.
